Lions Enter the Green Den

Dartmouth could not ask for more favorable conditions to snap a four-game losing streak. The Big Green are playing their homecoming game against Columbia, which is not only 0-5 this season, but also has won just 17 of the 81 meetings between the two programs.

Last year Dartmouth rallied for a 24-21 triumph in New York when **Conner Kempe** guided the Green on a 14-play, 69-yard touchdown drive for the winning score late in the fourth quarter. The Dartmouth defense then stuffed the Lions short of midfield to seal the win.

Kempe completed 24 passes for 235 yards in that game, but after throwing for 242 more yards the following week against Harvard, has topped 130 just once (159 at Sacred Heart) in the eight games since. Only two teams at the FCS level have thrown for fewer yards per game this season, and it is this production that Robert L. Blackman Head Coach Buddy Teevens seeks to improve.

Senior **Nick Schwieger**, with 110.2 rushing yards per game to rank 13th nationally, has accounted for nearly as many yards on the ground (551) as the passing game (552). This past week, he posted 112 yards for his fourth 100-yard game of the season and 12th of his career, the latter setting a Dartmouth all-time record. The week before he broke the school's career rushing record, and at his current pace would end his tenure with close to 3,000 yards.

The defense has given up over 400 yards per game to date (95th nationally), but it ranks much better in points allowed at close to 25 (48th), which goes to show that the "bend-don't-break" defense is accomplishing one of its goals. On the other hand, time of possession has not been in the Big Green's favor even once this season, and that was quite apparent at Holy Cross as the Crusaders held the ball for 17 more minutes.

There were some standout performances among the defensive unit, particularly senior defensive tackle **Eddie Smith**, who equaled his career highs with nine tackles and a pair of sacks. Senior safety **Joey Casey** had a personal-best 13 stops, and senior corner **Shawn Abuhoff** joined senior linebacker **Luke Hussey** with 11 tackles.

Special teams continue to shine for the Big Green with Abuhoff getting a chance to return a few kickoffs. Well, until he ripped off an 89-yard return to the Crusader seven, making it the longest non-scoring play in Dartmouth history. After that run, Holy Cross went to the squib kick to keep him from breaking another big one.

The Big Green have won five of the past six meetings against Columbia, with the lone loss coming in a veritable monsoon in New York three years ago. In last year's comeback victory, Kempe threw

for 235 yards and a touchdown while Schwieger broke loose for 124 — a far cry from the 242 he amassed two years ago at Memorial Field against the Lions — and two scores. The Dartmouth defense also provided four sacks in helping to contain Columbia quarterback Sean Brackett, who was held to 47 yards rushing while passing for 188.

Scouting the Lions

Like Dartmouth, Columbia has been a bit of a hard-luck loser this year with four of the Lions' five losses coming by single digits, including last week's 27-20 defeat against Penn when the Quakers scored a touchdown with 25 seconds to play. That scenario should sound familiar to Big Green fans as Penn stole a two-point win in Hanover three weeks ago thanks to a touchdown with 17 seconds on the clock.

The Dartmouth defensive game plan will likely be centered on containing Columbia's two-way threat behind center, Sean Brackett. The junior quarterback averages nearly 200 yards passing per game, but has completed just 48.6 percent of his passes in 2011. And while he leads the team in rushing with 218 yards, he gains just three yards per carry, and the Lions' top running back, Marcorus Garrett, has managed just 142 yards on 61 carries, or an average of 2.3 yards.

When Brackett does throw the ball, his favorite target is Kurt Williams, who has 23 receptions for 325 yards, nearly double that of any teammate. But watch for Paul Havas underneath coverage for some short gains, and tight end Hamilton Garner when the Lions are in the red zone. Garner has hauled in four of the team's eight scoring strikes, but has just 11 catches on the season.

The Big Green defensive line should get some opportunities to apply pressure on Brackett, as he has been sacked 17 times this year. Containment will be emphasized, especially after last week's game at Holy Cross in which the Crusader signal-caller posted over 400 total yards, 176 coming on the ground.

Lion linebacker Zach Olinger gets in the middle of just about everything for the Columbia defense as he leads the team with 42 tackles. He is also one of the team's hardest hitters having forced a pair of fumbles while recovering another. Columbia won't be afraid to blitz to put pressure on the Big Green quarterbacks, especially with nickelback Josh Martin whose 4.5 sacks rank third in the Ivy League.

Despite the pass rush, Columbia has yielded 243 yards through the air per game while picking off just one pass. The opposition has thrown 10 touchdowns and completed nearly 65 percent of its passes. So Dartmouth, which has struggled mightily this season throwing the ball, will try to take advantage of this vulnerability.

On special teams, Luke Eddy takes care of the placekicking duties. However, he has failed to convert three of his 14 PATs and has been called upon to kick just three field goals in five games, making two. The Lions have settled on Paul Delaney as their punter (having employed three this season), who has solid numbers with a 37.4-yard average. On returns, Alec Fisher is the primary specialist, but aside from breaking one punt return for 42 yards, has not yet distinguished himself.

Coaching the Lions is Norries Wilson, who is in his sixth season at Columbia. In his five-and-a-half seasons, he owns a record of 16-39. Wilson was the offensive coordinator at Connecticut for four seasons prior to his arrival at Columbia, and had the distinction of being one of five finalists for the Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2004. He also spent time as an assistant at Bucknell, Livingstone and North Carolina Central, plus served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Minnesota. A captain and two-year starter for the Gophers, Wilson graduated with a degree in psychology in 1989.

McMani Expected Back Saturday

Both senior **Tim McManus** and his brother **Ryan** were knocked out of recent games with concussions. But both receivers are expected to be available against Columbia. The elder McManus is among the top six at Dartmouth in career receptions and receiving yardage, while the younger recorded his first four catches at Yale on Oct. 1.

Holy Cross High Notes

- Senior **Nick Schwieger** added to his legacy by posting his 12th career 100-yard game with 112 on 22 carries. No other back has more than nine in Dartmouth history.
- Schwieger also scored the 20th rushing touchdown of his career, becoming the fifth player to do so and first since Jon Aljancic '97.
- Senior **Shawn Abuhoff** managed to return a kick-off 89 yards yet not reach the end zone. It is the longest non-scoring play in Dartmouth history.
- Senior **Eddie Smith** equaled his career highs in tackles (9) and sacks (2.0), plus set a new mark for tackles for a loss (3.0).
- Speaking of tackles, senior **Joey Casey** made a personal-best 13 stops, while linebackers **Bronson Green** and **Luke Hussey** each halted 11 Crusaders.
- Freshman **Bo Patterson** caught his first career touchdown, a 13-yard pass from **Conner Kempe** in the fourth quarter.
- Patterson and fellow rookie **Kirby Schoenthaler** were the top two receivers for Dartmouth, the second straight week two freshmen topped the team in receptions (top three against Yale).

Schwieger All-Time Leading Rusher

Although senior **Nick Schwieger** saw his streak of 100-yard rushing games end at four against Yale, he did surpass Al Rosier '91 as Dartmouth's all-time leading rusher. Rosier had 2,252 during his stellar career, but when Schwieger bolted six yards for a first down on his last run of the first quarter against the Bulldogs, the record was his. But Schwieger's 39 yards were his fewest since posting just 18 against Harvard in 2009 due to breaking his hand.

HEAD COACH



Buddy Teevens '79 is in his second stint at the helm of his alma mater, with his first tenure coming in 1987-91. In both 1990 and 1991, he led the Big Green to 7-2-1 marks, earning a share of the Ivy League title in '90 at 6-1, then winning the conference outright the following year at 6-0-1.

A native of Pembroke, Mass., Teevens was a standout quarterback for the Big Green as he was named the Ivy League Player of the Year and honorable mention All-American while leading Dartmouth to the league title as a senior in 1978. He also lettered in hockey, helping the Big Green to a third-place finish at the 1979 NCAA championship.

Teevens began his coaching career right after graduating, working with the running backs at DePauw. In 1980, he became the offensive coordinator at Boston University, where he stayed until 1985 when he was appointed as the head coach at Maine. In his two years with the Black Bears, he posted the first consecutive winning seasons (6-5 in '85, 7-4 in '86) at Maine in 21 years.

After his first five years with Dartmouth, he served five years as Tulane's head coach, four of which came while the school was without a conference. He was instrumental in building the foundation that allowed the program to achieve perfection in 1998 with an 11-0 record.

Teevens spent two years as the offensive coordinator at Illinois before three bowl seasons with the Florida Gators in 1999-2001.

Prior to his return to Dartmouth, Teevens spent three years as the head coach at Stanford, helping to rebuild the program there.

Campbell Trophy Semifinalist

The NFF selected Dartmouth senior linebacker **Luke Hussey** as one of 127 semifinalists for the 2011 William V. Campbell Trophy, which recognizes the best football scholar-athlete in the country across all levels. He is one of just four Ivy players among those listed and one of 33 from the FCS level. An engineering major, Hussey sports a stellar 3.94 GPA and is 10th in the Ivy League in tackles with 34. The NFF will select up to 16 finalists, each of which will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship and vie for the Campbell Trophy to be awarded on Dec. 6.

Another TV Game on Tap

The first night game in the 130-year history of Dartmouth football was televised nationally by Fox College Sports (FCS), marking the 18th straight year the Big Green have had at least one game broadcast on TV. Well, Dartmouth will have an opportunity to end an 11-game television skid when it plays its second-ever night game, this time at Harvard on Oct. 29 at 6 p.m. This time, the game will be shown regionally on FCS Atlantic.

Fletcher Staying Centered

Senior Austen Fletcher has been a mainstay on the offensive line since his freshman year. The center has started each of the last 31 games and 33 of 35 in his career.

The Block Party is Back

Last year, Dartmouth special teams managed to block six kicks, which ranked among the top 10 amongst all FCS schools. This year, the Big Green have proven the blocks were no fluke as they have equaled that mark already by rejecting two kicks in three of the first four contests. In the opener against Colgate, blocks on a short field goal attempt and a punt both proved pivotal in the 37-20 victory. Dartmouth then stuffed a Penn field goal and a PAT. Against Yale, it was a punt and PAT that fell victim to the special teams unit. Dartmouth is second in the FCS only to Portland State in total blocks.

Kickoff Returns Doing Just Fine

Last year Dartmouth featured **Shawn Abuhoff** as its key return man on kickoffs and punts. Abuhoff went on to receive All-America honors as a return specialist, and the Big Green ranked 63rd in the nation in kickoff return average. This year, with Abuhoff back for his senior year, teams mostly have decided to kick away from him, and Dartmouth now ranks 79th. The average starting point after a kickoff last year? The Big Green 34. This year? The Big Green 38. Perhaps the NCAA should come up with a better rating system than straight kickoff return average, such as kickoff return net average.

Shut Out at Yale

For the first time in nearly five years, Dartmouth suffered the ignominy of being shut out in a 30-0 loss at Yale on Oct. 8. The last team to hold the Big Green scoreless was Harvard back on Oct. 28, 2006 in a 28-0 contest at Memorial Field. The last blanking on the road? At Yale in 2005, 13-0. The offense also amassed just 178 yards, the first time it had been held under 200 since ... yep, at Yale two years ago when it gained just 127 yards.

Barstein Gets a Workout

Sophomore punter **Daniel Barstein** was summoned to the field 12 times during the loss at Yale, and his 11 punts were a career-high and just one shy of the Dartmouth single-game record, held by Larry Margerum (coincidentally at Yale in 1979). He would have tied the record had the Big Green not pulled a fake punt during which Barstein completed a pass. The ploy worked, but then failed when the ball was fumbled away after the receiver advanced past the first-down marker. It was that kind of day ...

Rain, Penn Spoil First Night Game

The first-ever night game lived up to its billing in terms of the exciting action on the field. The only problem was the outcome as Penn sent the Big Green to a grueling 22-20 defeat, scoring the winning touchdown with 17 seconds left after driving 89 yards in under four minutes. A steady rain that fell all day and night kept a number of fans at home, yet 8,117 brave souls still attended the historic event.

Getting Over the Hump

While Dartmouth's record since the start of the 2010 season is just 7-8, it's easy to think about what might have been with four of those seven losses decided in the final 90 seconds, and another in overtime. But to be fair, three of those seven Big Green victories were not decided until the last two-and-a-half minutes as well.

46-Yard FG, Foley Schmidt!

Looking to get points on the board when trailing 7-0 in the second quarter against Penn, Coach Teevens called upon **Foley Schmidt** to attempt a career-long 46-yard field goal. The senior got just enough on his kick to sneak it over the crossbar and through the uprights for three points. He added a 30-yarder later in the game, and with his two PATs, he climbed up to fifth on the Big Green's all-time scoring list with 154 points.

Double Your Fumble

The Dartmouth defense forced Quaker running back Brandon Colavita to fumble twice inside the red zone, and both times it was senior **Joey Casey** stripping the ball free. The first time sophomore linebacker **Bronson Green** managed to fall on the loose ball, and the second time it pushed Penn back from the first down it had gained and left the Quakers with a short field goal instead of 1st-and-goal.

Third Quarter Quota

Dartmouth was very much a second-half team in 2010, particularly the third quarter, scoring more points in that stanza than the entire first half (96-92). Nearly two-thirds of the team's points last year came in the second half (172-92). That trend has continued this year as the Big Green have put 37 points on the board in the first half compared to 58 over the final 30 minutes.

Sacred Heart-Broken

Dartmouth entered the game at Sacred Heart as sizable favorites, but despite tying the score on three separate occasions, never once could take a lead in a 24-21 loss. It was the second straight year

Joining the broadcast team this year is veteran broadcaster Dick Lutsk, who has over 40 years of local and regional radio broadcasting experience. While he is finishing up the baseball season with the New Hampshire Fisher Cats right now, he has also announced football at the University of New Hampshire, Boston College, Harvard on cable and, most recently, arena football for the Manchester Wolves. In addition, from 1990-95, Lutsk served as the pre- and postgame host for the Red Sox on Boston's WRKO/WEEL.

Lutsk will be paired with Wayne Young '72, who will provide analysis as he has for the 12th straight year. A two-sport athlete at Dartmouth, Young was a linebacker on three Ivy League championship Big Green squads from 1969-71 that went 25-2, earning first-team All-Ivy honors as a senior captain. He is a member of Wearers of the Green for having earned the Alfred E. Watson Trophy as Dartmouth's top male athlete in 1971-72.

the showdown between the two schools came down to a last-minute field goal — in 2010, the Pioneers missed a 38-yarder as the Big Green pulled out a 21-19 triumph. This year, SHU booted a 22-yarder with one minute left to break the deadlock, then blocked a 53-yard attempt by Dartmouth to end the game.

Record-Setting Return for Abuhoff

Senior **Shawn Abuhoff** set two records and tied another on his first punt return at Sacred Heart. His 90-yard return is the longest in the program's history and allowed him to break the Dartmouth record for career kick return yardage (punts and kickoffs). In addition, the All-America return specialist tied the school's career mark (held by Tim Copper '72) for touchdowns on punt returns with this being his fourth. And his career average of 12.06 yards leads

all-time leading return man, plus can set a new school record with four more interceptions.

Running back **Nick Schwieger** was the co-winner of the Bushnell Cup award last year as the Ivy League MVP and is aiming to set his own school mark for career rushing yards. He needs just 238 more to break the record held by Al Rosier '91. Blocking for him will be senior **Ryan O'Neill**, who is the third of the trio to be recognized. The left guard was part of a unit that allowed just seven sacks all last year and paved the way for Schwieger to rack up 1,133 yards on the ground.

Preseason All-Ivy

Last year, the Big Green earned six spots on the All-Ivy first team — the most for the Big Green in 14 years — and two more on the second team, all but one of whom returned this season. So it should not come as a surprise that Dartmouth led the league in preseason all-conference selections with 11 as chosen by Phil Steele's College Football Magazine.

Shawn Abuhoff was listed on the first team at both cornerback and punt return, while making the second team for kickoff return, accounting for three selections alone. **Nick Schwieger** was joined on the offensive first team by two linemen — **Austen Fletcher** and **Ryan O'Neill** — and senior tight end **John Gallagher**. Defensive players dominated the second team selections with linebacker **Luke Hussey**, free safety **Garrett Waggoner** and cornerback **J.B. Andreassi**, the last of which missed most of last year with an injury.

Forecasted for Fifth

Don't expect the coaching staff or the players to accept the fate the Ivy League media chose for them as Dartmouth was pegged for fifth in the preseason poll. Coming off their first winning season in 13 years and a fifth-place finish, the Big Green have plenty of experience back to vault further up the league standings. Penn was picked to win its third straight title, followed by Harvard, Yale and Brown. The last three spots in the poll were claimed by Columbia in sixth, and Cornell and Princeton tied for seventh. The complete poll is on page seven.

The Experience Factor

The offense features seven starters returning and the defense nine, with 15 of the 22 total starters on the two sides expected to be seniors. Many of those returners come at the skill positions, as evidenced by the numbers. As a team, Dartmouth gained 1,657 rushing yards a year ago; all but 26 of those yards are back with the Green in 2011 with nearly 1,500 of those yards claimed by **Nick Schwieger** and **Dominic Pierre**. Every pass thrown is accounted for, whereas a few more receiving opportunities should arise as 834 of the 1,779 receiving yards (46.9 percent) are gone. Defensively, 11 of 12 interceptions are back, while 617 of the 776 tackles (nearly 80 percent) are suiting up for the Green again. And don't forget those kickers — all punts, extra points and field goals are back, although a new leg will perform kickoff duties.

New Members of the Staff

There are few new faces on the Big Green coaching staff this year, most notably quarterback coach and passing game coordinator **Chris Rorke**, and defensive line coach **Calvin Thibodeaux**. Rorke is a 1989 graduate of Dartmouth and was a quarterback for the Big Green, throwing for over 1,200 yards as a junior. He has helped numerous schools to championships, including a share of the national title at Georgia Tech as a graduate assistant. He returned to Hanover in the early '90s on Coach Teevens' staff, and was a part of two Ivy championship squads. Other schools to benefit from his coaching were Illinois Wesleyan, Plymouth State, Lehigh and Trinity (Conn.) College.

Thibodeaux comes to Dartmouth after a successful stint as the defensive line coach at Navarro College which won the National Junior College Athletic Association national championship last fall. The defense produced 41 sacks and was ranked 12th nationally in total defense. He was a four-year letterman at Oklahoma, helping the Sooners win three Big 12 Championships while making a trip to a BCS bowl all four of his years there. He led the league with 10 sacks as a junior to earn All-Big 12 honors.

Also joining the staff are **Stephen Cully**, who is coaching the tight ends, and **Michael Bruno** as the video coordinator and director of football operations.

DARTMOUTH ON TELEVISION

Dartmouth football teams have played before live television cameras 73 times since 1953 when the Big Green met Holy Cross at Manning Bowl in Lynn, Mass., in the first New England college game televised nationally. In 2008, Dartmouth had six games televised live, the most ever in school history.

The 1953 game, won by the Crusaders, 28-6, was carried on NBC's 82-station network as part of the NCAA's restricted television agreement but wasn't

seen on the Dartmouth campus since there were no television stations serving northern New England at that time. The Dartmouth touchdown was scored by end Dave McLaughlin who later would serve as president of the college.

Frequently, during the early years of formal Ivy League football, Dartmouth played before major network regional audiences. Perhaps the most memorable game televised from Memorial

Field in Hanover was the 1971 game with Cornell that was ABC-TV's prime regional game with the broadcast team of Chris Schenkel, Bill Fleming and Bud Wilkinson. Cornell was undefeated and led by Heisman Trophy candidate Ed Marinaro. Dartmouth won, 24-14.

Dartmouth's record in televised games is 24 wins, 48 losses and one tie. The Big Green has a 14-26-0 record in games televised at Memorial Field.

SCHWIEGER SURPASSES 2,000 YARDS AS DARTMOUTH SOLVES COLGATE

HANOVER, N.H. — Senior running back Nick Schwieger ran for 175 yards on 20 carries, two of which went for touchdowns, as Dartmouth won its season opener for the second straight year in a 37-20 Big Green triumph over visiting Colgate at Memorial Field on Saturday afternoon. A crowd of 5,616 witnessed Schwieger surpass 2,000 rushing yards in his career, just the second Big Green back to achieve the milestone, sending Dartmouth (1-0) to just its second win in the last 12 meetings with the Raiders (1-2).

Schwieger piled up nearly half of his yards during the third quarter (81), including a 46-yard sprint down the left sideline. But his milestone run came on a nine-yarder late in the fourth quarter shortly before he scored the final points of the day with a two-yard burst. Schwieger finished his day with 2,015 career yards, just 238 yards shy of breaking the school record held by Al Rosier '91. Complementing Schwieger in the backfield was sophomore Dominick Pierre, who ran 15 times for 65 yards as the Big Green racked up 258 yards on the ground.

Colgate, playing without All-American tailback Nate Eachus who was scratched from the lineup 10 minutes before kickoff, relied heavily on quarterback Gavin McCarney. The sophomore enjoyed a fine day statistically, completing 26-of-34 passes for an even 200 yards while also leading the team in rushing with 122 yards on 23 carries with all three Raider touchdowns.

In the end, it did not matter that Colgate held the advantage in total yards gained, 384-320, and time of possession (7:42). When Dartmouth had a scoring opportunity, it capitalized by putting points on the board the five times it advanced to the red zone. The Raiders, meanwhile, converted just three-of-six opportunities inside the Big Green 20.

"All wins are good ones, but there is a lot of area for improvements, so I would say we're happy but not satisfied," head coach Buddy Teevens stated in a press conference after the contest. "We didn't get ourselves off the field defensively, and that was a disappointment. But the nice thing about our guys is that they have the maturity to recognize that. They are excited about the win, certainly, but know they have more work to do."

The emotion of the start of the season carried Dartmouth during the first possessions of the game. The defense stopped the Raiders cold on three quick plays, including a sack by senior Connor Phillips, then the offense covered 59 yards in eight plays as Schwieger and Pierre accounted for 50 of those yards. It was Pierre, however, who had the honor of traversing the final nine yards for the score, and senior Foley Schmidt's extra point made it a 7-0 game barely six minutes into the game.

Colgate answered directly to tie the game, gaining at least five yards on eight of nine plays during its possession with a mixture of runs and passes. On the last of those plays, McCarney bolted on a 12-yard touchdown keeper.

On the second play of the second quarter, Teevens turned to Schmidt for a 41-yard field goal,

which he provided with plenty of room to spare. After a three-and-out for the Raiders, Schmidt finished off a 12-play drive with another field goal, this time from 32 yards, for a 13-7 Big Green lead.

A 37-yard kickoff return by the Raiders' Nat Bellamy allowed Colgate to start in enemy territory on the final possession of the half. But after advancing as far as the four-yard line, the Raiders were forced to settle for a 26-yard field goal attempt. Senior Shawn Abuhoff managed to turn the corner and block the kick, however, to give Dartmouth a lift heading into the locker room and preserve the 13-7 advantage.

The Big Green took control of the game in the third quarter as Schwieger piled up the yards with 31 on his first three carries of the second half. Schmidt converted another 41-yard field goal, his career-high third of the game, for a nine-point lead, only to have Colgate rattle off an 11-play, 67-yard touchdown drive. McCarney's seven-yard scamper and Joe Uglietto's PAT made it a two-point game, 16-14.

Schwieger provided his 46-yard run on the next possession, and after a key 10-yard pass from senior Conner Kempe to Pierre on a 3rd-and-10, Schwieger burrowed his way for a four-yard touchdown and some breathing room at 23-14.

The decisive play of the game came when the Raiders were forced to punt from their own 33. Senior Alex Shulman was able to penetrate the protection and completely block the punt, and senior Brendan Murray recovered. If his helmet had not come off, Dartmouth would have had a touchdown on the play as Murray lateraled to the five to senior Joey Casey, who waltzed into the end zone. It turned out to be of no consequence as Kempe lofted a 19-yard scoring strike on the next play to senior Tim McManus in the back left corner with 1:10 left in the third quarter.

Colgate continued to pick up yardage, pushing down to the Dartmouth 15, only to have Phillips jar the ball loose from running back Danny Epstein. Sophomore linebacker Bronson Green pounced on the ball to account for the only turnover of the game. After Dartmouth punted for the only time all afternoon, the Raiders did not let another scoring opportunity slip away as they orchestrated a 10-play, 48-yard drive with McCarney scoring his third touchdown of the day on a two-yard run. Needing a two-point conversion to make it a one-possession game, McCarney came up just short of the goal line on a quarterback sneak.

With just 5:51 left in the game and trailing by 10 at 30-20, the Raiders attempted an onside kick, only to see the ball sail out of bounds, giving the Big Green the ball at the Colgate 39. Pierre rumbled for 20 yards before yielding to Schwieger who put the game away with his two-yard touchdown.

Green, Casey and senior Luke Hussey were defensive stars for the Big Green as each had at least 10 tackles. Phillips came up with some of the day's biggest plays, though, with the only sack of the game and the forced fumble.

PENALTIES, MISSED OPPORTUNITIES HAUNT DARTMOUTH IN 24-21 LOSS AT SACRED HEART

FAIRFIELD, Conn. — Sacred Heart booted a 22-yard field goal with one minute to play, then blocked a 53-yard attempt as time expired to pull out 24-21 homecoming victory for the host Pioneers (1-2) at Campus Field on Saturday afternoon. Dartmouth (1-1) was whistled for 10 penalties that added up to 94 yards and failed to score twice in the red zone as the Big Green dropped their first road contest of the 2011 season.

It was a reversal of fortunes for the two teams from last year when Sacred Heart failed to convert a 38-yard field goal in the final minute of play in Hanover, allowing Dartmouth to escape with a two-point victory. Today, the Big Green were victimized by a missed goal — also from 38 yards out — with 8:50 left in the game and the score tied at 21.

After the missed field goal, Sacred Heart went to work marching down the field, taking advantage of a pair of encroachment penalties against the Dartmouth defense. The more costlier of the two came on a 2nd-and-10 play at the Big Green 35 that senior cornerback Shawn Abuhoff stopped cold for a loss of a yard. Instead of 3rd-and-11, the Pioneers merely faced 2nd-and-5, and shortly thereafter had a 1st-and-goal at the five.

With time winding down, Dartmouth head coach Buddy Teevens started burning timeouts, and the defense responded with a stop on first down, then nearly recovered a fumble on a muffed exchange. With barely a minute to play and no timeouts left, the Big Green got a little help from Sacred Heart when a third-down pass fell incomplete, stopping the clock. Although Chris Rogers' kick split the uprights, Dartmouth still had a chance to get within field goal range to tie the game with exactly one minute remaining.

Senior quarterback Conner Kempe first connected with freshman Bo Patterson for a 26-yard completion to move into Sacred Heart territory. A toss to senior Tim McManus and another to Patterson both provided first downs, advancing the ball to the Pioneer 26, which was certainly within senior kicker Foley Schmidt's range, whose career long is from 45 yards. With just 13 seconds showing, McManus caught another pass at his shoelaces for a 12-yard gain, only to have the play negated by a holding penalty. After an incomplete, Schmidt came on to try the 53-yarder, but it was rejected by Paul Graziadei to close out the game.

Sacred Heart took control of the game from the outset, marching 60 yards in seven plays after the opening kick to take a 7-0 lead. Keshaudas Spence carried the ball six of those seven plays for a total of 46 yards, including the four-yard romp into the end zone.

After sputtering on its first possession, Dartmouth managed to put together its only sustained drive during the first 30 minutes when Kempe completed 5-of-6 throws on the second Big Green drive. Each catch was hauled in by a different receiver, the last of which was handled by freshman Kirby Schoenthaler on a 17-yard screen pass, tying the score at seven.

Before the first quarter came to an end, the Pioneers seemed to have a drive thwarted by penalties of their own. An illegal block and an illegal shift pushed Sacred Heart back from the Big Green 18 to the 33. But then the second quarter began, and Dartmouth gave those yards right back on an encroachment call and a face mask. Now with a 1st-and-10 at the 14, quarterback Tim Little teamed up with Rich Rossi for a touchdown pass and a 14-7 advantage.

Some Sacred Heart special teams trickery backfired on the Pioneers when they allowed Little to pooch punt on 4th-and-17 at the Dartmouth 35 in the middle of the second quarter. Abuhoff, an All-American as a return man last year, was ready for the kick, fielding it at the 10, losing ground a bit to dodge traffic before turning up the right sideline and taking it all the way for the touchdown. The 90-yard return is the longest in school history and the fourth of his career, tying another school record.

The second half did not start well for the Big Green, going three-and-out before having a punt partially blocked, giving Sacred Heart the ball at the Dartmouth 41. Two plays later, Spence broke several tackles to burst through the line and score on a 29-yard run.

The Dartmouth running game, which was nearly non-existent in the first half, finally got going. First, Kempe had to pick up a first down on 3rd-and-18 with a 28-yard pass to senior tight end John Gallagher. Senior Nick Schwieger broke off an 11-yard run during the drive, and sophomore Dominick Pierre finished it off with a 15-yard touchdown run with 7:18 left in the third quarter.

Now Sacred Heart found yards hard to come by, recording just one first down on its next two drives, and that one coming on a Big Green personal foul penalty. Meanwhile, Dartmouth twice turned the ball over on downs, advancing to the Pioneer 18 once and the 28 the next time after a J.B. Andreassi interception gave the Green the ball at the SHU 31. In the fourth quarter, Kempe guided the team down to the eight only to have an offensive pass interference call eventually leave Schmidt with his 38-yard field goal attempt that sailed wide right.

The Pioneers never trailed during the contest as Spence, making his first college start, pounded out 129 yards on 28 rushes while scoring two touchdowns. Little balanced out the Sacred Heart attack by completing 22-of-34 passes for 176 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

Despite rushing for just eight yards on six carries in the first half, Schwieger still managed to record his 10th career 100-yard game with exactly 100 yards on 20 carries. Kempe finished the day 14-of-32 passing the ball for 159 yards and one touchdown, while McManus led the receivers with five catches for 44 yards.

The two sides ended the day nearly even in total offense with Sacred Heart holding a slim 314-303 advantage, but the Pioneers held a 213-84 advantage at the half, while Dartmouth compiled 219 yards in the second half while the defense held SHU to 101.

FIRST-EVER NIGHT GAME SPOILED BY PENN THANKS TO TOUCHDOWN WITH 17 SECONDS TO PLAY

HANOVER, N.H. — Penn quarterback Billy Ragone orchestrated a 13-play, 89-yard drive that culminated with a three-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Calvert with 17 seconds remaining to lift the visiting Quakers to a 22-20 victory over Dartmouth, disappointing the 8,117 rain-soaked fans that witnessed the first-ever night game at Memorial Field on Saturday evening. Penn (1-2, 1-0 Ivy), the two-time defending Ivy League champion, extended its conference winning streak to 16 games thanks to Ragone, who completed all eight of his passes and accounted for 86 of the 89 yards with his arm and legs. The Big Green (1-2, 0-1 Ivy) fell for the second straight game in the final minute, despite a fourth-consecutive 100-yard rushing game from senior Nick Schwieger.

Dartmouth did not take the lead in the contest until the middle of the fourth quarter when Schwieger broke several tackles during a 27-yard touchdown run for a 20-16 lead with 8:27 to play. Two 15-yard penalties against Penn during the drive helped set up the score.

The Quakers quickly went three-and-out before punting back to Dartmouth, which managed one first down on a 13-yard pass from senior quarterback Conner Kempe to senior tight end John Gallagher. But after three runs that gained a total of five yards, Big Green punter Daniel Barstein was summoned to pin Penn deep in its own territory, which he did at the 11 with 3:57 to play.

Ragone immediately went to work with a pair of runs that covered 18 yards, then started the air attack with a seven-yard completion to his tight end, Luke Nawrocki. When faced with a 3rd-and-1 at the Penn 48, Ragone kept the ball for an eight-yard gain to push into Big Green territory. He completed each of his next four passes to penetrate down to the 11, then tossed a pass to Ryan Mitchell who scampered into the end zone, only to have the touchdown erased by a holding call.

The penalty turned out to be merely a momentary setback as Ragone connected with Joe Holder for 18 yards. After a Penn timeout, Ragone threw to Calvert, despite the latter being well-covered by a Dartmouth defender. But Calvert battled to keep his grasp on the pass for the winning score and the only touchdown for the Quaker offense all night. The Big Green kept their slim hopes alive by blocking the extra-point attempt, meaning a field goal would win the game.

Dartmouth fielded a squib kick and advanced to its own 43 with just 11 ticks showing on the clock and two timeouts left. Kempe stepped up in the pocket, only to fire a ball into the arms of Quaker linebacker Jason Rasmussen, leaving the simple formality of a kneel-down to end the game.

Buddy Teevens, Dartmouth's Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach, stated about Ragone's late-game heroics, "I thought he did a great job. He could not afford to make a mistake and he didn't. We had some pressure on him. He made some very accurate throws, no errant throws and we didn't have an opportunity to pick the ball off or deflect passes.

"It was a great football game," he continued. "The two teams played hard and give them credit, in that final drive they did what they had to do. I thought

my guys played hard throughout the ballgame and played physical football. It was tough coming so close and not finishing on top. We did a lot of things well, but we have to regroup and go forward."

Both defenses controlled most of the game, and neither side could mount much offense at the outset. Late in the first quarter, Penn had just three first downs — which led to a 38-yard field goal that was off the mark — and Dartmouth nary a one when the Big Green took over at their own 20. In the Wildcat formation, the Green snapped the ball to senior wide receiver Tim McManus, who had it jarred loose by Quaker linebacker Erik Rask. The ball popped up into the air and landed in the waiting arms of defensive lineman Brandon Copeland, who loped 15 yards into the end zone for a surprising 7-0 Penn lead.

A 17-yard Schwieger run pushed Dartmouth past the 50 for the first time late in the first quarter, leading to a career-long 46-yard field goal by senior Foley Schmidt on the first play of the second stanza.

Penn went right back on the attack, moving into the red zone before senior safety Joey Casey stripped the ball loose from Brandon Colavita and sophomore linebacker Bronson Green recovered it at the Big Green 12. Penalties by both sides marred the Dartmouth drive that lasted nearly five minutes but advanced just 25 yards. In the final six minutes of the half, the Quakers drove twice to convert a pair of field goals by Connor Loftus, one from 44 yards and the second from 35, despite the protests of Coach Teevens who believed time expired before the ball was snapped.

The first Dartmouth touchdown came in the third quarter after junior Teddy Reed blocked a Penn 36-yard field goal try. Schwieger ran four times for 25 yards and sophomore Dominick Pierre posted runs of 16 and 17 yards during the drive, while Kempe completed each of his four passes, the final one to a wide-open Gallagher in the end zone for an eight-yard touchdown toss. Schmidt's extra point made it a 13-10 game.

Penn still led 13-10 entering the fourth quarter, then doubled that lead less than two minutes into the period on Loftus' third field goal of the day, this one from 27 yards out. The Big Green responded with a 30-yard field goal by Schmidt, which was set up by a 34-yard pass from Kempe to freshman Kirby Schoenthaler. On the next drive, Schwieger broke off his long touchdown run, giving Dartmouth its only lead of the night.

Ragone, who completed more passes on the final drive than the rest of the entire game, finished the night 15-of-25 for 160 yards through the air and the one touchdown. While he gained 63 yards on the ground on 14 carries, Colavita led the Quakers with 102 yards on 24 rushes.

Schwieger took the handoff 26 times for 125 yards and a touchdown, while Pierre amassed 41 yards on just four runs. Kempe completed 11-of-23 passes for 126 yards with one score and his first two picks of the season, plus was sacked for the first time this year. The Big Green, which had managed just 69 yards of offense by halftime, broke out in the second half for 206 yards for a total of 275 on the night.

DARTMOUTH STYMIED AT YALE, SUFFERS FIRST SHUTOUT LOSS IN FIVE YEARS

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — The Yale Bulldogs handed Dartmouth its first shutout loss in nearly five years in a 30-0 contest on Saturday afternoon at the Yale Bowl. All four touchdowns for Yale (3-1, 2-0 Ivy) covered at least 40 yards as the Bulldogs racked up 480 yards of offense. Although Big Green senior Nick Schwieger broke the school's career record for rushing yardage, Dartmouth (1-3, 0-2 Ivy) managed just 178 total yards and only once advanced beyond the Yale 37-yard line.

The last team to hold the Green scoreless was Harvard on Oct. 28, 2006, in a 28-0 Crimson victory in Hanover. Dartmouth has now lost nine straight meetings with Yale, with the last Big Green win coming in 2002.

Of the Bulldogs' 480 yards, 269 came on the ground. Alex Thomas averaged over 10 yards per carry while galloping for 130 yards on just 12 rushes, including a 74-yard touchdown on the game's fourth play from scrimmage. Mordecai Cargill also took a handoff 12 times, gaining 83 yards with a 40-yard scoring sprint. The Yale air attack was guided by quarterback Patrick Witt who completed 21-of-29 passes for 203 yards and a touchdown, while Chris Smith led the receiving corps with six catches for an even 100 yards and the scoring reception.

After the Bulldogs began the game with Thomas' long touchdown run, they got the ball back and drove into the red zone. Yale lined up for a 29-yard field goal attempt, but ran a fake with the holder Jake Semones attempting to run through the line. Dartmouth was wise to the trick play and stuffed Semones well short of the first down. The Big Green could not muster anything offensively, however, and shortly after a punt, Cargill rattled off his 40-yard touchdown run. The saving grace for Dartmouth came on the PAT when senior Shawn Abuhoff blocked the kick to keep the score at 13-0.

In the second quarter, the Big Green had a golden opportunity to swing momentum in their favor when senior Joey Casey picked off a Witt pass across the middle. During his return, he slipped on the grass and fell as the ball came loose for a fumble. Yale pounced on the ball to regain possession, netting a nine-yard gain in the process.

The defense ruled the roost into the intermission with the only other points of the half coming just before with four seconds left on a 39-yard field goal. The score was set up by a fumble on a sack of Big

Green sophomore quarterback Andy Gay, making his first career start. Dartmouth was able to recover the fumble at its own one, but eventually was forced to punt from the back of the end zone. The kick traveled just 22 yards, however, giving Yale the ball at the 25-yard line with 1:17 remaining. Dartmouth's defense was up to the challenge, making the Bulldogs settle for the Philippe Panico field goal, giving Yale a 16-0 lead.

Yale dominated the first half, gaining 266 yards to just 51 for Dartmouth. Gay was just 3-of-11 passing for 14 yards for the Big Green while Schwieger ran for 39 yards on 11 carries. For the Bulldogs, Thomas topped the century mark in the first 30 minutes with 101 yards on nine rushes, and Witt was 13-of-18 for 98 yards and one interception.

The second half did not start any better for Dartmouth, even with senior quarterback Conner Kempe back under center. A three-and-out forced a punt, which Yale's Gio Christodoulou returned untouched 53 yards for a touchdown and a 23-0 lead.

The next Dartmouth possession was stopped just inside Yale territory at the 47-yard line. Needing a spark, Dartmouth's Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach Buddy Teevens called for a fake punt on 4th-and-5. Sophomore punter Daniel Barstein completed a short toss to Casey, who appeared to have enough for the first down, only to lose his hold on the ball, which Yale recovered.

The Big Green finally got a great scoring opportunity late in the third quarter when freshman Chai Reece partially blocked a Bulldog punt, giving Dartmouth the ball at the Yale 20. Yet the Green could not capitalize with three incomplete passes, the last on 4th-and-2. Yale turned right around and moved into Dartmouth territory by the end of the third quarter, then Witt tossed a 44-yard touchdown bomb to Smith on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Schwieger, who entered the game sixth nationally in rushing average at over 130 yards per game, ran 16 times for just 39 yards, ending a streak of four straight 100-yard games. It was also his lowest output since breaking his hand against Harvard two years ago when he took the ball a mere 10 times for 18 yards. Kempe came off the bench to complete 11-of-21 passes for 97 yards. Leading the defensive effort was sophomore nickelback Mike Banaciski with nine tackles.

COMEBACK BID FALLS SHORT AS DARTMOUTH DROPS FOURTH STRAIGHT

WORCESTER, Mass. — On a blustery day featuring winds regularly over 20 mph and a second-quarter rainstorm at Holy Cross's Fitton Field, the host Crusaders were able to hold off the Dartmouth Big Green by a final score of 25-17. Ryan Taggart threw for 250 yards and set a Holy Cross quarterback record with 176 yards rushing to help the Crusaders (3-3) snap a two-game skid. Dartmouth (1-4) was led by senior Nick Schwieger and his 112 rushing yards, but it was not enough to keep the Big Green from losing their fourth straight game.

Holy Cross finished the day with a sizable offensive advantage, gaining 522 yards to just 224 for Dartmouth as the Crusaders had the ball for nearly two-thirds of the game (38:31). Taggart completed 29-of-41 passes to achieve his 250 yards through the air and ran the ball 23 times for an average of 7.7 yards per carry. His preferred target was wide receiver Gerald Mistretta, who caught 12 passes for 103 yards and one of Taggart's two touchdown tosses.

While Schwieger was able to post his 12th career 100-yard game on the ground — the most ever by a Dartmouth player — the rest of the offense struggled to consistently move the ball. Senior Dan Rooney made his first career start behind center in an attempt to jump-start the passing game, but he completed just one pass for 10 yards over the first three quarters before senior Conner Kempe replaced him and went 7-of-16 for 73 yards and a touchdown.

Dartmouth received the opening kick for the first time in 12 games, but failed to get a first down on the opening possession, Holy Cross quickly moved down the field for a 7-0 lead as Taggart completed all four of his passes during the drive, including a 13-yard touchdown to Mistretta.

The Crusaders added a 23-yard field goal courtesy of John Macomber after advancing 79 yards to the Big Green six on their next possession. The three points were made possible by a 45-yard quarterback keeper on 3rd-and-15 at the Holy Cross 15. But it would have been worse for Dartmouth had senior cornerback Shawn Abuhoff not gotten a hand on a potential six-yard touchdown pass on the play before the field goal.

Dartmouth recorded its first first down of the game on the last play of the first quarter when Schwieger bolted for 16 yards across midfield. But a few plays into the second quarter, Tom Mannix picked off a Rooney pass at the 25, which turned out to be the lone Big Green turnover.

Now it was time for the Dartmouth defense to make a stand. On 2nd and 1 at the Big Green 39, the Crusaders were stopped cold on three straight plays, turning the ball over on downs. Five plays later, Schwieger broke off a long run down the Holy Cross 10, but had the ball knocked loose by Chandler Fenner. Fortunately for the Big Green, the ball bounced right to freshman wide receiver Bo Patterson, who continued the play down to the two. On

third down, Schwieger dove over the pile for his 20th career touchdown, and senior Foley Schmidt's extra point made it a three-point game at 10-7.

Driving into the wind and eventually rain, Holy Cross began to meticulously march toward the goal line, eventually reaching the Big Green four. But a holding penalty and a sack by senior Eddie Smith pushed the Crusaders back to the 23, and on the final play of the half, they had to take a shot at the end zone. Abuhoff was up to the challenge, swatting the pass away as time expired for the intermission.

Holy Cross wasted little time in scoring to start the second half, beginning with a 50-yard kickoff return by Andrew Zitnik to the Big Green 40. Six plays later, Sam Auffant barreled in from three yards out for the touchdown, but a wayward extra-point attempt left the score at 16-7.

Abuhoff saw Zitnik's return and raised him with an 89-yarder down to the Holy Cross seven. Yet Dartmouth had to settle for a Schmidt 22-yard field goal when Rooney's third-down pass to senior tight end John Gallagher could not be handled.

Taggart doubled the lead from six to 12 points by orchestrating a nine-play, 72-yard drive that culminated with a quick one-yard pass to tight end Alex Schneider. When the snap on the PAT attempt was bobbled by Taggart, the Crusaders' lead remained at 22-10.

Another long, sustained Holy Cross drive ended with a 20-yard Macomber field goal, only because the Dartmouth defense was able to come up with another goal-line stand. Smith once again was at the center of the push, dropping running back Reggie Woods for a two-yard loss on 3rd-and-goal at the one.

A Holy Cross fumble early in the fourth quarter, recovered by senior Royce Egeolu, gave the Big Green a terrific scoring opportunity at the Crusader 32. A Schwieger 12-yard run and a face-mask penalty put Dartmouth on the six with four plays to get into the end zone, but the Green could manage just two yards before turning the ball over on downs.

After another Smith sack and a defensive stop, Dartmouth needed two touchdowns and a two-point conversion in the last 4:35 of the game. Kempe went to work by completing 7-of-11 passes to cover 86 yards, the last being a 13-yard touchdown to Patterson with 2:19 to play.

Schmidt provided a well-placed onside kick, but Dartmouth could not corral the loose ball on the ground. Then facing 4th-and-1, a Holy Cross gamble paid off when Eddie Houghton picked up three yards for the first down. Two kneel-downs later, and the game was official.

Three Big Green defenders had at least 11 tackles, led by strong safety Joey Casey with a career-high 13. Senior linebacker Luke Hussey made 11 stops, as did Abuhoff for a career-high, while Smith also posted a personal best with nine tackles including his two sacks.
