Homecoming Clash of Undefeateds

For the second time in the past three years, Dartmouth enters its homecoming game with a perfect 3-0 record on the season, and its opponent, Yale, also unblemished. The Bulldogs would rather forget the outcome of that contest as the Big Green handily defeated Yale by a final of 35-3.

The difference this year is that Dartmouth has had to squeak out two games on the final play this year, but won all three games in 2015 by at least three touchdowns. The Bulldogs are simply the reverse of that, winning every game this year by at least 25 points, but just getting by two opponents two years ago by a combined total of eight points.

The most recent close call for the Green came at Penn in the Ivy League opener for both teams last Friday on national television. The Quakers took their only lead of the game on a field goal with 5:37 to play, but Dartmouth drove the length of the field and scored on a one-yard **Jared Gerbino** plunge into the end zone as time expired for a 16-13 victory over the co-defending conference champion.

The Big Green offense has been a nice mix of running and passing thus far, but a bit heavier on the ground game. Senior **Ryder Stone** leads Dartmouth with 249 rushing yards while picking up 5.5 yards per carry, and recently surpassed 1,000 career yards. Gerbino — a Wildcat QB — emerged as a force at Penn, running 11 times for 71 yards, including the game-winning score.

The starting quarterback, **Jack Heneghan**, doesn't have gaudy numbers, but he has been effective throwing the ball, completing over 69 percent of his passes for 417 yards and four scores without an interception. He is coming off the most accurate game of his career, connecting on 23-of-30 throws for 199 yards and a TD against the Quakers.

Though he missed the season opener, sophomore WR **Hunter Hagdorn** has made up for lost time, leading the Green with 16 catches and 145 yards. With another 149 yards, he would become the 21st player in Dartmouth history with 1,000 receiving yards to his credit. Heneghan will also throw to any number of targets, including H-back **Vito Penza** (8 rec., 76 yds.) and WR **Emory Thompson** (7-81).

While the offense was posting 414 yards against Penn, the Dartmouth defense was shining by holding the Quakers to less than half (243 yards) of their season average (587) and a quarter of the scoring average (53.5). Junior LB **Jack Traynor**, the Big Green's leading tackler on the season, had nine stops (one for a loss) and a pass breakup to earn Ivy League Defensive Player of the Week honors.

The defensive effort is truly a team effort, however, with seven different players credited with sacks and 10 having successfully defended at least one pass. Senior LB **Eric Meile** has 23 tackles, two less

than Traynor, and junior NG **Jackson Perry** has 17, including a team-high five for a loss.

The kick coverage teams have been solid, particularly on punts with opponents gaining a grand total of one yard in three games thanks in large part to the hang time **Davis Brief** provides. Senior **David Smith** has shown improved distance on his place-kicking as well, setting personal longs each of the past two weeks from 42 and 43 yards. He has also converted all 32 PAT tries in his career.

Scouting the Bulldogs

For the second straight week, Dartmouth goes up against an undefeated team with gaudy offensive numbers, this time with homecoming as a backdrop. The Yale Bulldogs are on a roll with a perfect 3-0 mark having scored at least 41 points in each of those three triumphs, plus are just outside the top 25 in the FCS Coaches Poll.

Last week the Bulldogs jumped out to a 21-0 lead by the end of the first quarter en route to a 41-10 romp over Fordham. Deshawn Salter ran for 118 yards and three touchdowns on just eight carries, while Zane Dudek scored twice among his 10 rushes for 56 yards.

The running game has been stout for Yale in the first three games, ranked ninth nationally while averaging more than seven yards per rush. Dudek has 360 yards on just 35 carries for 10.3 yards per carry, and Salter 303 yards and seven touchdowns on 33 rushes for a 9.2-yard average.

The passing game has been extremely effective as well with QB Kurt Rawlings completing 76.2 percent of his passes (tops in the FCS) for 620 yards and six scores, placing him third in pass efficiency as well.

Rawlings has a trio of targets that he has shown preference for, beginning with Christopher Williams-Lopez. The senior wideout has 15 grabs for 202 yards to lead the Bulldogs in both categories. Both tight end Jaeden Grahman and rookie Melvin Rouse II have caught a pair of touchdowns while combining for 19 catches and 224 yards.

On the other side of the ball, the Bulldogs feature an excellent pass rush, leading the FCS at five sacks a game. No less than four players each have three to their credit — DEs Charles Callender and Kyle Mullen, DT Copache Tyler and LB Matthew Oplinger.

Like Dartmouth, Yale rotates players in and out of its defensive sets as no one player has more than 15 tackles (free safety Haden Carlson), though 16 different players have at least six stops to their name.

Alex Galland handles all of the kicking duties and is second in the league with a 41.6-yard average on his punts. And while he made his first 18 PATs before missing the last one against Fordham, he has failed to convert either field goal attempt this year, one from 47 yards out and the other a 24-yard try that was blocked, both during the first game.

Head Coach of Football, Tony Reno has pushed his overall record above .500 (27-26) with the three wins to start this season. Yale has been in the top half of the league standings each of the past four years, and nearly earned a share of the 2014 title before coming up just short in a tough loss to rival Harvard in the final game. Reno is a 1997 graduate of Worcester State College and was hired at Yale as an assistant in 2003 after a successful five-year stint at his alma mater.

Down to the Wire

When **Jared Gerbino** bulled his way into the end zone against Penn to lift Dartmouth to a 16-13 victory on Sept. 29, it was the first time in almost 46 years that the Big Green won a game on the final play of regulation. Back on Oct. 23, 1971, Ted Perry '73 drilled a 46-yard field goal as time expired to give Dartmouth a (coincidentally) 16-13 win at Harvard. Since then, the Big Green had won 20 other games thanks to scores in the final two minutes (including a win at Holy Cross five years ago with one second remaining) before the win at Penn this year. Has Dartmouth ever won on the final play at home? Well, that will take more investigating. Maybe another time ...

Defensive Player of the Week

Junior LB **Jack Traynor** may not have posted gaudy numbers in the 16-13 win at Penn on Sept. 29, but he led the Dartmouth defense with nine tackles, one for a loss, and a PBU as the Big Green stifled a Quaker offense that was ranked in the top three nationally in scoring, total yards and rushing. Traynor enters this game with 25 tackles on the season, tops on the team and seventh in the Ivy League.

Semifinalist for Campbell Trophy

Senior QB **Jack Heneghan** was announced as one of the 181 semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy, given to the top football scholar-athlete in the nation at any level, NCAA or NAIA. Seven of the eight Ivy League schools have a player on the list, a conference record. A total of 12-14 finalists will be announced on Nov. 1, each receiving an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship, while the winner will receive an extra \$7,000. Heneghan is an economics major with a 3.79 grade point average.

Smith Pushing His Limits

Senior PK **David Smith** split the uprights with a 43-yard field goal to end the first half at Penn, giving Dartmouth a three-point lead at the break, 10-7. It was a career long for the Canadian, marking the second straight week he broke his personal mark. Against Holy Cross on Sept. 23, he had a 42-yarder early in the second quarter before ending that half with a field goal from 35 yards out.

For those who are unable to watch the stream of the game live, an archived broadcast of the full game will be available within 24 hours after the contest on the ILN.

The Dartmouth Sports Network begins its second year on ESPN Radio, serving as the home for all 10 football games. Fans can tune in locally on 94.5 FM and 1230 AM, or stream it live anywhere in the world at 945espn.com.



Back for his third year calling the action will be Adam Giardino, a 2011 graduate of the University of Connecticut. Giardino is completing his fifth year providing play-by-play for the Trenton Thunder, the AA affiliate of the New York Yankees, and he has been a part of football broadcasts at UMass and Brown as well as his alma mater in his undergraduate days.

Giardino will be paired with Wayne Young '72, who will provide analysis as he has for the 18th consecutive year. A two-sport athlete at Dartmouth, Young was a linebacker on three Ivy League championship Big Green squads from 1969-71 that went 25-2, earning first-team All-Ivy honors as a senior captain. He is a member of Wearers of the Green for having earned the Alfred E. Watson Trophy as Dartmouth's top male athlete in 1971-72.

HEAD COACH



Buddy Teevens '79, who as a player led Dartmouth to the 1978 Ivy League championship, has won three more conference titles in 17 years as the Big Green head coach. He first earned consecutive crowns in 1990 and '91 in his first stint, then guided Dartmouth to

its league-record 18th Ivy League title in 2015.

A native of Pembroke, Mass., Teevens was a standout quarterback for the Big Green as he was named the Ivy League Player of the Year and an honorable mention All-American while leading Dartmouth to the league title as a senior in 1978. He also lettered in hockey, helping the Big Green to a third-place finish at the 1979 NCAA championship.

Teevens began his coaching career by working with the running backs at DePauw before becoming the offensive coordinator at Boston University in 1980. His first head coaching gig came at Maine, posting the first consecutive winning seasons (6-5 in '85, 7-4 in '86) there in 21 years.

After his first tour at his alma mater, he served five years as Tulane's head coach. He was instrumental in building the foundation that allowed the program to achieve perfection in 1998 with an 11-0 record. Teevens then spent two years as the offensive coordinator at Illinois before three bowl seasons with the Florida Gators in 1999-2001.

Prior to his return to Dartmouth, Teevens was the head coach at Stanford for three years.

Do Penalties = Bad?

Dartmouth was able to overcome 11 penalties for 105 yards to pull out a 16-13 victory at Penn on Sept. 29. And certainly coaches hate to lose yards due to penalties, but perhaps those fouls aren't so bad. Since 1972, the Big Green have piled up at least 100 penalty yards in 15 games, yet have gone 12-3 in those contests. And in the 38 contests in which they have been whistled 10 times for penalties in that span, Dartmouth's record is 29-8-1. Now, I'm not advocating breaking the rules, but ...

Controlling the Ball

Not only did Dartmouth win the battle for time of possession at Penn by over nine minutes (34:36 to 25:24), it also had the ball longer in each of the four quarters. The Big Green ended up running 78 plays compared to just 50 for the Quakers. Only four times in the last 45 years has an opponent run fewer plays in a game, three of which were shutouts, and the other a 21-16 win at Brown six years ago (49).

Close Calls

Dartmouth has won its last two games by a combined four points, which is quite a rarity in the Big Green annals. The last time Dartmouth won consecutive games by a combined margin as small came back in 1982 with a 14-12 triumph over Harvard before a 14-13 win at Cornell the next week. The only other instance came in 1947 with victories against Brown (13-10) and Harvard (14-13). So I guess you're wondering what the record is for fewest points in three straight wins? Big Green broadcaster Wayne Young '72 should know, for it was his senior year in 1971 against Brown (10-7), Harvard (16-13) and Yale (17-15) for a total of eight points.

Running Down a Dream

Well, if amassing 200 rushing yards is a dream, this note makes sense. Dartmouth has started the year by running for at least 200 yards in each of the first three games. Only once in the past 20 years have the Big Green had three consecutive 200-yard games on the ground, that coming in 2013 when Dartmouth had at least 200 in the first four contests. And in the last 40 years, the feat has been achieved just nine times, the longest streak coming in 1995 at six games.

Taking Care of the Ball

Through three games, QB **Jack Heneghan** has completed 47 passes at a 69.1 completion rate (Big Green record is 67.5 percent) without an interception. It has not been uncommon for Dartmouth to go three consecutive games without an interception, but rarely has it gone four. Dalyn Williams managed to do it in the first four games of the 2015 season, and the only other such streak in the last 45 years came in 1973 when the Big Green had a stretch of five games without an INT. Granted, the 1973 quarterbacks only completed 40 passes in those five games ...

Around the Hagdorn

Sophomore WR **Hunter Hagdorn** has kept busy since returning to the field for the second game of the season. Against Holy Cross, he led Dartmouth with seven receptions for a modest 54 yards, then boosted those numbers to nine catches for 91 yards

and his first TD of the season. He now has 72 grabs for 851 yards and two scores in his career.

Receivers or Rushers?

Both senior **Emory Thompson** and **Drew Estrada** are wide receivers, but they have been taking handoffs at least as often as they have caught passes. Thompson has seven catches for 81 yards and seven runs for 49 yards to date. Estrada has been a bit more extreme with just three receptions compared to 12 rushes, nine coming at Penn. He is the fourth-leading rusher on the Big Green with 74 yards.

Television Terrors

This Penn game was televised nationally on NBC Sports Network, and there was a time when that would have been a bad omen for the Big Green. Starting late in the 1999 season through early in the 2013 campaign, Dartmouth played in a televised game 32 times, going a woeful 4-28. But since a 20-13 homecoming victory over Yale in 2013, the Green have gone 10-6 when on TV, including the win over the Quakers. When on NBC Sports Network, Dartmouth is 4-4, alternating wins and losses along the way. A complete listing of televised games is on page six of these notes.

Nine Straight Non-League Wins

With the 27-26 win over No. 25 Holy Cross, Dartmouth has now won its last nine non-conference games dating back to the 2014 season, beginning with a 24-21 victory over the Crusaders. This streak matches the longest the Big Green have had since Ivy League play began in 1956 — a nine-game streak spanning the 1962-66 seasons.

Special Teams Player of the Week

While it wasn't the first time that senior **Jeremiah Douchee** had blocked two kicks in one game, it was the first time those blocks earned him the Special Teams Player of the Week, and not just from the Ivy League office, but from STATS as well for all of the FCS. His block of a 32-yard field goal attempt with 6:09 left in the fourth quarter against Holy Cross held Dartmouth's advantage at six points, while his PAT block in the final seconds of regulation preserved a tie and forced overtime, giving him five blocks in his career. The last national player of the week for the Big Green was **Isiah Swann** who took home rookie honors last year, while the last Ivy Special Teams Player of the Week was Charlie Miller '17 last year. Both Swann and Miller won their honors after a 20-17 win over Towson.

Overdue in Overtime

It had been eight years since Dartmouth won a game that went into overtime. That win came at Memorial Field as well, a 20-17 double-overtime triumph over Cornell on Nov. 7, 2009. Since then, the Big Green had played three other games into overtime, all three of which came on the road with the last two at Penn. In 2010, the Quakers came away with a 35-28 win after just one overtime period, then took four overtimes — the longest game in Ivy League history — to dole out a heartbreaking, 37-31 defeat four years ago. In all, Dartmouth has played 11 games beyond regulation, going 5-6 in those contests (5-3 at home, 0-3 on the road).

100 to Top 1,000

Senior RB **Ryder Stone** took the handoff 17 times against Holy Cross, amassing 103 yards with a 44-yard touchdown. It was his second career 100-yard game, and first since going for 114 against Brown in his rookie campaign. While topping the century mark, Stone also became the 28th Big Green player to run for 1,000 yards in a career. In fact, it was his 44-yard score that pushed him past the milestone. And with 17 receiving yards and 46 more returning a pair of kickoffs, Stone posted a career-best 166 all-purpose yards in the 27-26 overtime victory.

More Special Play

Douchee wasn't the only player to excel on special teams against Holy Cross on Sept. 23:

- Senior **David Smith** scored a career-high nine points with field goals from 42 (a career long) and 35 yards, plus converted all three extra points, keeping him perfect in 31 PATs in his career.
- Sophomore **Davis Brief** shined in his second game as the Big Green punter, averaging 40.7 yards on six punts with enough hang time to have the coverage hold the Crusaders to negative return yards.
- Senior **Danny McManus** brought back three

punts for a total of 51 yards with a long of 26. He is fourth nationally in punt return average (19.5).

- When Holy Cross attempted to win the game with a two-point conversion in overtime, it was the first attempt by an opponent since the Crusaders pulled one off three years ago. Dartmouth hasn't scored on a two-point try in 10 years when Tim McManus '11 (oldest brother of Danny) caught a pass from Alex Jenny '10 against ... Holy Cross in 2007. Granted, the Green have only attempted three since then.

Sack or Bust

Junior DE **Jimmy McHugh** has worked his way into the rotation up front, making appearances at Stetson and against Holy Cross. While he made only one tackle in each of the first two games, both just happened to be sacks. That's right. He has two career tackles, and both are sacks. Pretty good ratio.

Speaking of Sacks ...

Dartmouth had a pair of sacks in the 27-26 win over Holy Cross, one from McHugh as noted above, the other by junior LB **Jack Traynor**, the first of his career. Traynor also contributed a career-best 11 tackles, tying for the team lead with senior LB **Eric Meile**.

Déjà Vu for Thompson

Senior WR **Emory Thompson** started the scoring in the 27-26 overtime victory over No. 25 Holy Cross in the home opener on Sept. 23 by snaring a 22-yard touchdown toss in the first quarter. Oddly enough, the other scoring snare of his career came in a one-point win over a nationally ranked team in a Dartmouth home opener — last year against No. 22 New Hampshire, 22-21. Cue the Twilight Zone theme ...

Five Firsts

Dartmouth scored five touchdowns in its season-opening victory at Stetson, and every one of those scores were the first in the career for each player:

- Junior RB **Rashaad Cooper** had the first points with a 10-yard touchdown run.
- Sophomore Wildcat QB **Jared Gerbino** punched into the end zone from a yard out.
- Senior TE **Cam Poole** hauled in a five-yard toss.
- Sophomore NB **D.J. Avery** picked off a Hatter pass and returned it 30 yards to the house.
- Junior RB **Matthew Shearin** scampered 16 yards up the middle to complete the game's scoring.

The last time five different Big Green players scored touchdowns in the same game was just last year against Holy Cross. The 38 points were also the most for Dartmouth since a 41-20 victory at Penn on Oct. 3, 2015.

Cooper and Stone

Tell me that wouldn't be a great title for a buddy flick. You can't do it. In the season opener, the two buddies shared the load carrying the ball as each just narrowly missed out on 100-yard games. **Rashaad Cooper** finished the day with a career-high 97 yards and a touchdown on 14 carries, while **Ryder Stone** had 96 on 17 rushes (not to mention a 57-yard burst that was called back due to a penalty). The last two Dartmouth players to top 100 in the same game were former QB Dalyn Williams '16 (100) and ... Stone (career-high 114) against Brown on Nov. 15, 2014. Guess that was the prequel to my imaginary movie, which could also be about making barrels and filling them with rocks.

How Many Yards?

Led by Cooper and Stone, Dartmouth amassed 324 yards on the ground against Stetson, a total surpassed just twice this millennium — 330 at Cornell on Nov. 3, 2012 and 325 against Columbia on Oct. 26, 2013. On the flip side, the 82 passing yards mark the first time the Big Green failed to reach 100 since a 28-24 victory over Princeton in the snow at Memorial Field four years ago (92). The last time with less than 82 yards through the air? The 2011 season opener versus Colgate (62), also a Dartmouth win at 37-20. And the seven completions were the fewest over the last 20 years save that 2013 Princeton game as well (4).

How Many Yards? Part II

The Dartmouth defense produced one of its stingiest games of the past 50-plus years when it beat Stetson 38-7 on Sept. 16. The Hatter offense mustered just 94 total yards, the fewest for a Big Green opponent in 25 years (Oct. 10, 1992 vs. Holy Cross — 92), and had negative yardage on the ground (minus-3). The last team to rush for fewer yards against Dartmouth was New Hampshire with minus-38 — a Big Green record — in the 1965 season opener, 52 years ago.

Pick Six

For the first time in 19 games, a Dartmouth defender intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown as sophomore **D.J. Avery** snared an errant Stetson throw for a 30-yard score late in the third quarter. The last TD on an INT was pulled off by David Caldwell '16 with a 77-yarder against Sacred Heart on Sept. 26, 2015.

Heneghan Tops 3,000 Total Yards

With his 29-yard keeper early in the second quarter at Stetson, senior QB **Jack Heneghan** became the 12th Big Green player to reach 3,000 total yards in a career. He finished the day with 3,119, and after Penn has 3,469, putting him into eight place on the career list.

Last to Kick Off

The Ivy League football schedule always starts a couple of weeks after the rest of Division I. For the fifth time in the last six years, Dartmouth was the last team to kick off its season, due to the 6 p.m. start time at Stetson. Each of the other seven conference schools kicked off earlier in the day.

Hovering Around .600

This is the 136th season of football for Dartmouth, during which the Big Green have played 1,192 games and posted a record of 692-454-46, a winning percentage of .600 (rounded up). To finish the season at .600, the Green need to win at least four more games this year.

Quick Fun Fact

Dartmouth scored 21 points in the third quarter at Stetson and seven more against Holy Cross, giving the Green more points in that quarter thus far (28) than all of last season (24).

Preseason Poll

Last year, for the first time in eight seasons, the Big Green failed to outperform their expected finish in the preseason poll. After claiming a share of the Ivy League crown in 2015, Dartmouth was picked to finish third last fall, but dropped to eighth thanks to three losses by a combined seven points.

This year, Dartmouth was chosen for a fifth-place showing with Princeton and Harvard tying for the top spot in the standings. Princeton's co-champ last year, Penn, was pegged for third, though all three teams had at least five first-place votes (the Tigers received six). On a positive note, over the past 20 years, the media has correctly picked the champion just three times — Penn in 2003, and Harvard in 2008 and 2015. The Experience Factor

Dartmouth has a fair amount of experience returning to the field in 2017 with nine offensive starters back and six on defense. The running game remains almost completely intact with 1,216 of its 1,299 yards on the roster (93.6 percent), while quarterback Jack Heneghan accounted for all but 62 of the passing yards (97.8 percent). Very few receivers graduated as well with 2,464 receiving yards (88.4 percent) back in the fold. On defense, two of the top three tacklers moved on, and three of the top six, but the Big Green still have 473 of 748 stops (63.1 percent) on the sideline. Also, five of the seven interceptions are still with the team, as are seven of the nine fumble recoveries.

Tri-Captains

For the seventh time in the past eight seasons, Dartmouth will feature three captains leading the squad — seniors **Jeremiah Douchee**, **Jack Heneghan** and **Kyran McKinney-Crudden**.

Returning All-Ivy Performers

Last year, the Big Green claimed a total of 11 players who earned All-Ivy honors, two of which made the first team and another who was Ivy League Rookie of the Year in WR **Hunter Hagdorn**. Of those 11 players, however, only five return to the field for Dartmouth this fall — second-teamers Hagdorn and DE **Nick Tomkins**, along with honorable mentions OL **Matt Kaskey**, LB **Eric Meile** and RB **Miles Smith**.

CSM Preseason All-Ivy

The College Sports Madness website released its three preseason All-Ivy League teams, and Dartmouth had 10 players named a total of 11 times with sophomore **Hunter Hagdorn** earning a spot on the first team at wide receiver and third team as a kick returner. Joining Hagdorn on the first team were junior OL **Matt Kaskey** and senior LB **Eric Meile**. Two offensive players (junior RB **Miles Smith** and senior TE **Cameron Skaff**) along with a pair of defensive players (senior DL **Nick Tomkins** and sophomore CB **Isiah Swann**) were selected for the second team, while junior LB **Jack Traynor**, senior CB **Jarius Brown** and senior S **Colin Boit** made the third team. Harvard led the way with 16 selections over the three teams, and Penn had the most first-team selections with eight.

Still All-Time Ivy Champs

Since the Ivy League began play in 1956, no other school in the conference has won more football titles than Dartmouth with 18. The last time an Ancient Eight squad had more crowns than the Big Green was in 1961 when Yale had the grand total of two. The next season, Dartmouth equaled that total and has never looked up at another team since. But Penn picked up its 18th championship last year to match the Green, putting the 55-year streak in jeopardy should Penn win the race for a third straight year.

Record Book Watch

While no career records are in jeopardy of being broken, there are a few individuals that can move into the top 10 all-time at Dartmouth in several categories. **Jack Heneghan** needs to throw for 1,518 yards to move into fourth in career passing yards, and just 1,152 to make the top-four in total yards.

Senior **Ryder Stone** just surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards, and with three more rushing touchdowns would become the 10th to run for 20 TDs.

Should sophomore **Hunter Hagdorn** match his receiving totals from his Ivy League Rookie of the Year campaign, he would already be tied for 10th in career catches (112).

2016 Recap

I imagine most people remember quite a bit from last year, but if you are like me, you still need a little refresher on how things shook out:

- Dartmouth finished the season 4-6 overall but 1-6 in conference play to finish 8th for just the second time in 61 years of Ivy League play (2008). Only Harvard has finished alone in last fewer times (1), with Princeton matching the Big Green total.
- Linebacker **Folarin Orimolade** became the first Bushnell Cup winner for Dartmouth since Nick Schwieger in 2010 and the first All-American since Schwieger in 2011.
- Wide receiver **Hunter Hagdorn** picked up some hardware as well by being named the Ivy League Rookie of the Year after catching 56 passes for 706 yards, ranking third and second in the league in those categories, respectively.
- The Big Green began the season with a memorable victory, topping 22nd-ranked New Hampshire, 22-21, thanks to a 15-point rally in the fourth quarter. It was Dartmouth's first win over UNH in 40 years.
- Three of the losses in league play came by three or fewer points, including a 9-7 wind-blown loss at Columbia. That ended a streak of 51 consecutive games scoring in double figures, the longest in Big Green history.
- The lone conference victory came on the road at Cornell, 17-13, giving the Big Green eight consecutive wins over the Big Red, their longest win streak against any Ancient Eight opponent.
- Dartmouth finished among the top 20 FCS schools in a couple of the major statistical categories with the passing game 15th (278.7 yards per game) and the scoring defense tied for 18th (21.3 points per game).

Free Agents

Following the 2016-17 year, two Dartmouth players were signed by NFL organizations — Bushnell Cup winner **Folarin Orimolade** (Los Angeles Rams)

and **Charlie Miller** (Jacksonville Jaguars). Neither ended up making their respective teams, though Orimolade made it through the entire preseason before being released. Last year, three Big Green graduates signed free agent deals in **Dalyn Williams** (Chicago Bears), **Jacob Flores** (Green Bay Packers) and **Vernon Harris** (Kansas City Chiefs), none of which are still with those teams. The last Big Green player to play in the NFL was FB Casey Cramer '04, who played for five years with the Carolina Panthers, Tennessee Titans and Miami Dolphins.

New Coaches on Staff

The Dartmouth coaching staff went through a few changes since the 2016 campaign came to a close. Coach Teevens brought in Kevin Daft, a 1999 graduate of UC Davis and two-time All-American quarterback for the Aggies, to serve as the offensive coordinator. Daft had success at his alma mater in the same role for the past four years.

Also joining the offensive staff is Cheston Blackshear to coach the offensive tackles and tight ends. A 2000 graduate of Florida, Blackshear most recently spent three years at Nevada, and also logged four years at New Mexico prior to a year at Georgetown. He is no stranger to the Ivy League having been on the Columbia staff from 2006-08. As a Gator, he played in four bowl games and won a national championship during his freshman year.

Last year's offensive quality control coach, Steve Thames, was promoted to coaching the running backs, and former Big Green safety Kyle Cavanaugh returned to Hanover to fill that role.

BIG GREEN FOOTBALL 2017 BOX SCORES

DARTMOUTH WINS EIGHTH-STRAIGHT SEASON OPENER IN 38-7 ROMP AT STETSON

HANOVER, N.H. — The Dartmouth football team opened its 2017 season with a 38-7 victory over Stetson on Saturday night at Spec Martin Memorial Stadium thanks to a smothering defense that held the host Hatters (0-3) to a mere 94 yards of offense. Junior nose guard Jackson Perry proved to be a handful up front, leading the Big Green (1-0) with eight tackles, 3.5 for a loss with 1.5 sacks, to help Dartmouth to win its eighth straight season opener.

Five different players scored touchdowns for Dartmouth — each score being the first of their respective careers — as the Green dominated the ground game. Junior Rashaad Cooper and senior Ryder Stone led a rushing attack with 97 and 96 yards, respectively, as Dartmouth racked up a total of 324 on the ground, its most in four years.

The defense, meanwhile, would not give Stetson any room to run with the Hatters recording minus-three yards on 26 carries, the fewest yards for a Dartmouth opponent in at least 45 years. Bryce Blackmon managed 18 yards on 15 carries, but thanks in large part to five sacks, Stetson could not post positive yardage via the ground game.

Holding a slim 10-7 advantage at the start of the third quarter, the Big Green got their offense on track right away with a nine-play, 71-yard drive that culminated with sophomore Wildcat quarterback Jared Gerbino sneaking into the end zone from a yard out on a keeper. The big gain came through the air, however, as senior Jack Heneghan connected with junior Dylan Mellor on a 27-yard completion after Dartmouth managed negative-three yards through the air in the first half.

Following a quick three-and-out for the Hatters, the offense took over near midfield thanks to a 19-yard punt return by senior Danny McManus. Just five plays later, Heneghan found senior tight end Cam Poole in the back corner of the end zone all alone for a five-yard scoring strike. Not only was it the first touchdown of Poole's career, but also his first catch, giving the Green a 24-7 advantage.

Late in the third quarter, it was the defense's turn to put points on the board. Sophomore nickelback D.J. Avery stepped in front of a Stetson pass and scampered 30 yards untouched for a pick-six and 31-7 lead, effectively putting the game out of reach.

Dartmouth tacked on one final touchdown when junior running back Matthew Shearin darted up the middle from 16 yards out on his third career carry, finishing off a 12-play, 81-yard drive that lasted over six minutes.

While the final numbers display Dartmouth's dominance, the Big Green sputtered at times in the first half as they showed symptoms of a team playing its first game, despite an interception by senior

linebacker Eric Meile on the game's first play from scrimmage. Dartmouth failed to score, however, as the drive stalled at the four and the 22-yard field goal sailed wide to the left.

The game remained scoreless throughout the first quarter thanks in part to a pair of Big Green fumbles in their own territory. But Stetson could not capitalize on the terrific field position, losing nine yards after the first recovery and eight on the second before punting away both times.

Dartmouth finally got on track offensively early in the second quarter by running just six times to cover 80 yards. Heneghan had the biggest gain on a 29-yard keeper, while Cooper ran the final two plays, gobbling up 10 yards with the second providing the game's first score.

Stetson answered by putting together its only sustained drive of the day, running 13 plays for 75 of the team's 94 yards on the night. Justin Jordan provided the touchdown by hauling in a six-yard pass from Colin McGovern, who finished the game 17-of-30 for 88 yards and the two interceptions.

A 46-yard McManus punt return late in the first half gave Dartmouth the opportunity to enter the locker room with a lead. The Big Green were denied a touchdown when J.J. Johnson broke up Heneghan's third-down pass in the end zone to junior Drew Hunnicutt, forcing Dartmouth to settle for a 25-yard field goal courtesy of senior David Smith with just 17 seconds showing on the clock.

Dartmouth finished the game with 406 total yards as Heneghan was 6-of-13 for 71 yards and a touchdown toss. As a team the Green averaged 5.6 yards per carry with Cooper's career-high 97 yards on 14 carries and Stone's 96 on 17 rushes leading the way.

The defense dropped two Stetson quarterbacks for five sacks, paced by Jackson. Seniors Justin Edwards and Jimmy McHugh both had solo sacks, and senior Nick Tomkins, junior David Emanuels and sophomore Niko Lalos each helped out on others.

Notes: Not only did Dartmouth win its eighth straight season opener, it also won its eighth straight non-conference game dating back to the 2014 season ... Heneghan surpassed 3,000 total yards for his career with his 29-yard run in the second quarter. He finished the day with 3,119 total yards to his credit ... the fewest rushing yards for any Big Green opponent was negative-16 by New Hampshire back in 1965 ... Dartmouth did not have 100 yards passing for the first time since the 2013 season finale against Princeton, but the 324 yards rushing were its most since picking up 325 against Columbia that same season.

TWO BLOCKS IN FOURTH QUARTER HELP BIG GREEN BEAT #25 HOLY CROSS IN OVERTIME

HANOVER, N.H. — Dartmouth's Jeremiah Douchee blocked a PAT attempt with his hip in the final seconds of regulation to force overtime, then thwarted a two-point conversion in overtime to clinch a thrilling, 27-26, home-opening victory over the visiting 25th-ranked Holy Cross Crusaders (2-2) on Saturday night at Memorial Field. Junior linebacker Jake Moen came up with the stop on the two-point pass attempt, giving the Big Green (2-0) its second victory over a ranked opponent in as many seasons and ninth straight over a non-conference team.

Senior tight end Stephen Johnston shed a tackler to turn a short gain into a 10-yard touchdown pass on Dartmouth's possession to begin overtime, which combined with the PAT kick by senior David Smith gave the Green a seven-point lead. Although the Crusaders scored a touchdown of their own one play after converting on fourth down for the sixth time in as many attempts, the Dartmouth defense sniffed out the screen pass on the two-point attempt with Moen making the initial hit and senior Danny McManus securing the stop to preserve the win.

Holy Cross held a one-point lead at the intermission, 14-13, that held up until the final minute of the third quarter. The Crusaders muffed a punt near midfield, which was recovered by McManus at the bottom of the pile. Two plays later, senior Ryder Stone, who finished with his second career 100-yard game (17 carries, 103 yards) broke through the line and outraced the Holy Cross defense 44 yards to the end zone for a 20-14 Big Green lead. That run also pushed him past 1,000 yards on the ground for his career, the 28th Dartmouth player to do so.

The Crusader offense was on the field for more than 10 minutes in the fourth quarter and threatened to score with little more than six minutes on the clock. But when facing 4th-and-3 from the Big Green 15, Holy Cross decided to take three points, only to have Douchee get one of his paws on the kick to keep it from reaching the goalposts.

A 51-yard punt by Dartmouth sophomore Davis Brief and a fumble on the return sent the Crusaders all the way back to their own 14 with 3:46 remaining. But after two quick first downs, a 36-yard pass from Peter Pujals to Blaise Bell — one of his game-high nine catches for 119 yards — quickly flipped the field. With 13 seconds to play, Holy Cross had one last chance to reach the end zone on 4th-and-goal at the six. Pujals rolled to his left to get more time, then hit Bell in the back of the end zone for the game-tying score. But the PAT attempt was low, allowing Douchee to get his body on the ball and give the Big Green a reprieve to win the game in overtime. Dartmouth actually recovered the block and returned it the distance of the field with a few laterals, but one was ruled an illegal forward pass, negating the defensive two-point conversion.

Dartmouth struck first on the unseasonably warm, muggy evening in Hanover when senior quarterback Jack Heneghan hit senior Emory Thompson in stride from 22 yards out midway through the first quarter.

On the first play of the second quarter, Holy Cross capped off a 12-play, 73-yard drive when Pujals first connected with Bell on a seven-yard score, tying the game at seven.

The Big Green responded three minutes later when Smith booted a career-long 42-yard field goal for a 10-7 advantage.

A Heneghan fumble at midfield set up the next Crusader score, a seven-yard scamper by Miles Alexander to put the visitors back on top. But Smith was called upon again as time expired in the half, converting a 35-yard field goal to cut the deficit to one at the intermission, 14-13.

Holy Cross outgained Dartmouth overall with 394 total yards compared to 366, but the Big Green picked up more on the ground (203 yards to 172) and while the Crusaders had more through the air (222-163).

Heneghan enjoyed the most accurate passing night of his career, hitting on 72 percent (18-of-25) of his throws for 147 yards to go with his two touchdown tosses. Sophomore Hunter Hagdorn was his favorite target, hitting on seven passes for 54 yards, while Thompson snared four throws for 42 yards and his second career touchdown, both of which have come against ranked teams.

Pujals, who entered the game averaging just over 300 yards through the air, completed 25-of-47 for 222 yards and two scores to Bell, but also one interception by Big Green safety Colin Boit. Diquan Walker led the Crusader ground game with 46 yards on a dozen carries.

Senior Eric Meile and junior Jack Traynor led the Dartmouth defensive effort with 11 tackles apiece with the latter collecting his first career sack. The secondary broke up no less than 11 Holy Cross passes, with nickelback Kyran McKinney-Crudden credited with three. McManus not only recovered a fumble and swatted away two throws to go with six tackles, but also averaged 17 yards on three punt returns.

Ryan Brady had 13 tackles for the Crusaders, while Nick McBeath had 11 and Ahmad Tyler contributed an even 10.

Notes: Last year Dartmouth opened the season at Memorial field with a 22-21 victory over New Hampshire, which was ranked 22nd among FCS programs at the time ... the nine-game win streak against non-conference opponents is tied for Big Green's longest since the Ivy League started formal play in 1956 ... Heneghan has won both of his starts against ranked programs, both by a single point ... the Big Green had lost three straight overtime games dating back to 2009, all of which came on the road ... the last home game that went into overtime was a 20-17 Dartmouth victory over Cornell (double overtime) ... Thompson's other catch against a ranked team came last year in the win over UNH ... Stone has 1,029 yards on the ground in his career, and his other 100-yard game came in his freshman year in 2014 when he picked up 114 yards against Brown ... Douchee has blocked five kicks in his career.

GERBINO POWERS INTO END ZONE ON FINAL PLAY TO LIFT DARTMOUTH TO 16-13 ROAD WIN AT PENN

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — Trailing by three and facing 4th-and-inches with three seconds to play, Dartmouth decided to go for the win on the road at Penn. That decision was rewarded by quarterback Jared Gerbino, who ran straight up the middle into the end zone for the winning touchdown as time expired, giving the Big Green (3-0, 1-0 Ivy) a 16-13 victory over the host Quakers (2-1, 0-1 Ivy) in a nationally televised game on Friday night at Franklin Field.

Dartmouth had to drive 80 yards after Penn took its only lead of the night with a 27-yard field goal by Jack Soslow with 5:37 remaining. As they had done most of the evening, the Big Green methodically marched down the field, even overcoming their 11th penalty of the night after converting a 4th-and-3 play, putting them in a 1st-and-20 situation near midfield.

Gerbino, Dartmouth's Wildcat quarterback, had the big play of the drive with a 27-yard burst on 3rd-and-4 from the Quaker 42, giving the Green a first down at the 15-yard line with 30 seconds left. A 13-yard end around by senior Emory Thompson made it 1st-and-goal from the two, but after three plays, the Big Green were still outside the end zone with a decision to make.

"I looked at our team and asked them what they thought," said Buddy Teevens, the Robert L. Blackman Head Coach for Dartmouth. "To a man, they said that we had this and wanted to win the game right there instead of going for a field goal to send it into overtime. So that's what we did, and we got the push up front we needed to get Jared into the end zone."

Dartmouth racked up 414 yards with a balanced offensive attack, gaining 215 on the ground and 199 through the air as senior quarterback Jack Heneghan completed 23-of-30 passes with one touchdown and no interceptions. Gerbino led the ground game with a season-high 71 yards on 11 carries, while sophomore wide receiver Drew Estrada had nine rushes for 52 yards and senior running back Ryder Stone had 11 attempts for 50 more. Sophomore Hunter Hagdorn led all players with nine catches for 91 yards and a touchdown.

The Penn offense, which entered the game in the top three among FCS schools in total offense (587 yards), scoring (53.5 points) and rushing (334 yards), was limited to just 243 total yards, 13 points and 85 yards on the ground. Quarterback Will Fischer-Colbrie was accurate throwing the ball at 19-of-26 for 158 yards and a score, but running back Karekin Brooks managed just 47 yards on 14 carries to lead the ground attack.

The Big Green dominated play in the first quarter with their offense on the field for over 10 minutes. But it wasn't until the second quarter that they were able to push the ball into the end zone as Heneghan connected with Hagdorn on a play-action pass from 12 yards out to complete an eight-play, 67-yard drive.

Penn managed to respond late in the opening half thanks in part to a pair of costly Dartmouth

penalties. A pass interference and a facemask put the Quakers on the Dartmouth eight-yard line, and two plays later, Will Fisher-Colbrie found Justin Watson in the back of the end zone for a six-yard score, knotting the game at seven with 1:20 on the clock.

After a touchback on the ensuing kickoff, the Big Green once again were able to move the ball effectively, reaching the Quaker 26. Penn tried to ice placekicker David Smith to no avail as the senior drilled a career-long field goal for the second straight week, this time from 43 yards for a 10-7 lead as the clock expired.

Dartmouth had a chance to extend that 10-7 lead late in the third quarter, but a 42-yard field goal attempt sailed wide to the left. Penn responded by driving down to the Big Green 14 before settling for a 31-yard Soslow field goal, knotting the game at 10 with 30 seconds left in the stanza.

In the fourth quarter, the Quakers threatened to reach the end zone, and a pass interference penalty on a 3rd-and-6 pass kept the drive alive at the Dartmouth 14. But the defense stopped Watson a yard short of a first down, and a false start on 4th-and-1 forced the hosts to settle for a 13-10 lead on the Soslow 27-yard field goal. Fifteen plays later, the Big Green had their victory as time expired.

Linebacker Jack Traynor led the stout Dartmouth defense with nine tackles while seniors Eric Meile and Danny McManus each had eight. The Big Green controlled the football for better than nine minutes more than Penn, running 78 plays to just 50 for the Quakers, thanks in part to converting 9-of-16 third downs and 2-of-2 fourth downs, both coming during the final drive.

Watson finished the night with six grabs for 55 yards and a pair of rushes for 26 more. On defense, linebacker Nick Miller came up with a dozen stops, and Louis Vecchio recorded the lone sack for either side.

Neither team turned the ball over, but Dartmouth's 11 penalties were marched off for 105 yards. Penn was whistled just six times for 35 yards.

The Big Green host Yale (2-0, 1-0 Ivy) next week for homecoming. The game kicks off at 1:30 p.m. and will be streamed live on ESPN3 and the Ivy League Network with Bob Lipman and Ken Cail on the call. Dartmouth fans can also catch the game on 94.5 ESPN Radio over the airwaves and online at 945espn.com with Adam Giardino and Wayne Young '72 describing the action.

Notes: This is just the second time in the last 20 seasons that Dartmouth has started a season 3-0, the other coming two years ago when the Big Green won a share of the conference crown ... Dartmouth had not won a game against Penn that was decided by seven points or less since 1996 with the Quakers winning the last eight ... the Big Green improved to 35-48-2 in the series with the Quakers ... with his second completion of the night, Heneghan became the ninth Dartmouth QB to throw for 3,000 yards in a career. He finished the game with 3,181 to his credit.
