THIS WEEK

Dartmouth women's hockey will host travel partner Harvard on Wednesday at 6 p.m., playing the Crimson for the second time in a month and a half. The game can be viewed on both the Ivy League Network (ILN) and ESPN3.

LAST TIME OUT

The Big Green dropped two very close games to Princeton and Quinnipiac at home over the weekend.

Dartmouth vs. Princeton

A Tiger goal scored with just over a minute to go in the third period lifted Princeton over Dartmouth, 3-2, on Friday.

Sarah TabEEK, Megan Cornell and Linda Essery ended the night with their first career points. Cornell netted the Green's first goal, while TabEEK (in her first game in a hockey jersey) assisted, and Essery got the helper on Sydney Hill's second goal of the last two games.

There were a combined nine penalties in an 11-minute span in the first period, but neither team was able to find the back of the net during that time. Princeton outshot Dartmouth, 12-4, but had few opportunities that posed much of a threat.

After a messy first period, both teams found their stride in the second. At 2:48, TabEEK intercepted a Princeton cross and passed to Cornell, who backhanded the puck over goalie Rachel McQuigge's head. Less than four minutes later, Hill got her second goal of the last two games, firing to the right of the netminder following passes by Turner and Essery. At 11:09, Princeton got one back, and Dartmouth headed to the third with a 2-1 edge.

It seemed as if the Tigers had tied things up a minute into the third, but after extended video review, it was found that there was goalie interference and the Big Green remained a tally ahead. Princeton was relentless, outshooting

Dartmouth, 23-0, before scoring the equalizer at 14:00. With sights set on overtime, the Tigers scored their third at 18:43 to take the lead. Junior Alyssa Baker had a great opportunity to tie things up again, but the shot went just wide and time expired.

The Tigers outshot the Big Green, 50-13, and went 1-for-8 on the power play, while Dartmouth was 1-for-6, as Hill's marker was scored with just over 10 seconds to go with the extra player. Junior Christine Honor played well, ending the night with 47 saves.

Dartmouth vs. Quinnipiac

Tess Bracken netted her first goal of the season with 50 seconds to go in the third in Dartmouth's 2-1 loss to Quinnipiac on Saturday.

Essery also picked up a point with her second assist of both the weekend and her career. Honor had another good game between the pipes, ending up with 39 saves.

Quinnipiac had a 9-0 shot advantage in the first, though few posed much of a threat to Honor. Hailey Noronha played a large part in keeping the Bobcats out of the net with her four blocked shots.

The second period was better for Dartmouth, which had its first scoring opportunity at the 16-minute mark when Alyssa

Baker and Kate Landers went 2-on-1 with netminder Abbie Ives, but the Bobcat goalie thwarted the attempt. After 36 minutes of scoreless play and some great saves by Honor, Quinnipiac got on the board, scoring at 15:14 and 19:01 to take a 2-0 lead heading into the third.

Dartmouth did not stop trying to get that goal and, with just 50 seconds to go in the third, it paid off. Bracken, receiving the puck from Essery, shot to the left of Ives from the face-off dot to cut the Bobcats' lead to one with little time left on the clock.

SCOUTING THE CRIMSON

Harvard enters Wednesday's game with a record of 6-4-1 and 4-2-1 in ECAC Hockey play. This past weekend, the Crimson went 1-1, falling to Quinnipiac by a score of 2-1 before rebounding to defeat Princeton, 4-1. Four Harvard players have double-digit points and are led by Brooke Jovanovich with her five goals and seven helpers.

Shaunessy netted Dartmouth's lone goal in the 4-1 loss. At 11:24 of the third, Shaunessy bested netminder Beth Larcom, finding the back of the net with just five seconds remaining on the 5-on-3.

AND IN NET

Honor has started 10 of the team's 11 games so far this season. In 509 minutes, she has made 306 saves while allowing 32 goals and has a .905 save percentage and 3.77 goals against average. She has won two games, both by shutout. Shannon Ropp has played in four contests, has made 71 saves while allowing nine goals and has an .888 save percentage

and 3.69 goals against average. She has a record of 1-0-0. Dartmouth's third netminder Kayla Wormsbecher has not yet seen any playing time.

The Big Green will have three weeks away from the ice to enjoy some time with their families before returning to Thompson to close their nine-game homestand and the first half of the season against UConn on New Year's Eve.

COACHES CORNER



It was announced in June 2017 that Joe Marsh will serve as the Dartmouth women's hockey interim head coach for the 2017-18 season while Laura Schuler assumes head coaching responsibilities for the Canadian Olympic Team.

Marsh is the former longtime head coach of the St. Lawrence men's hockey team, guiding the Saints from behind the bench for 27 years from 1985 through 2012. During his time in Canton, Marsh amassed a program-record 482 wins with two regular season ECAC Hockey titles and five tournament championships. In both 1988 and 2000, Marsh led the Saints to the NCAA's Frozen Four, taking his team to the national title game in the former. In all, the 1977 UNH graduate guided SLU to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

The two-time National Coach of the Year (1989 and 2000), Marsh was also tabbed as the recipient of the Tim Taylor Award as ECAC Hockey's top coach four times during his career (1989, 1992, 2000 and 2001), the most in league history.

"I'm excited to step in and help Laura's program," Marsh said. I'm coming into a program that Laura and her staff are continuing to establish on a national level. Philosophically, we are on the same page.

"The transition should be easy because of how well she has built and organized this program in her time here," Marsh continued.

Marsh will fill in for Schuler who has the honor to serve as the Canadian Women's National Team Head Coach once again. Schuler's responsibilities with Team Canada will take her away from Hanover for the season as she looks to guide her team to a fifth straight Olympic Gold Medal in PyeongChang, South Korea, in February.

"It's really exciting to have someone of Joe's caliber, experience and character step in," Schuler remarked. "There is no doubt he will help to take our team in a positive direction.

"Joe and I spent a lot of time talking about our team's vision, direction and plan," she continued. "It was evident this will be a smooth transition and I felt that both he and I were on the same page."



Chris Cobb is in his second season with the Dartmouth women's hockey team.

Cobb comes to Dartmouth from ECAC Hockey rival Union, where he served as an assistant coach for the 2015-16 season. While

in Schenectady, Cobb was responsible for recruiting prospective athletes, managing the forwards, pre-scouting opponents, video breakdown for individual and team use and conducting skills sessions.

Prior to that, he spent three seasons at Williams, helping lead the Ephs to a NESCAC title and an appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight. During his tenure, he was responsible for recruiting, video breakdown and managing the defense and goalies. He coached two first-team All-Americans, three first-team and one second-team All-NESCAC award winners, one NESCAC Player of the Year and one NESCAC Rookie of the Year.

Before Williams, Cobb spent five years as the head coach at UMass Amherst and three seasons as an assistant coach at Amherst. At UMass, his teams went 68-48-13 in five seasons and had five ACHA national tournament appearances, three ECWHL Championship game appearances, and two ACHA Final Four appearances. At Amherst, Cobb's primary responsibility was coaching the goalies. The program went 63-14-7 in his three seasons, including two NCAA appearances, and three NESCAC championship game appearances, winning the 2010 NESCAC and NCAA Division III National Championship.

Cobb has also spent time as the assistant coach of the ACHA women's national team, coaching the squad on a tour of Europe playing games against various professional teams. Cobb received his bachelor of science in kinesiology from UMass in 2007 before going on to receive his master's in coaching education from Ohio University.



Morgan Illikainen is in her first year as an assistant coach with the Big Green women's hockey team.

A 2015 Dartmouth graduate and a former alternate captain, Illikainen returns to Hanover after spending a

season as the hockey and lacrosse assistant at the Northwood School in Lake Placid, New York.

While at Northwood (2016-17), she assisted with planning, organizing and instructing all on-ice practices and lifts, working mostly with the defensive core unit. In addition, she helped with recruiting and had an active role in admission decisions. She also worked with the lacrosse team throughout the 2017 season.

Illikainen's time away from the rink and the lacrosse field was spent in the classroom, as she served as the world history teacher. She was responsible for all facets of planning, organizing and instructing daily history lessons to sophomores.

Illikainen graduated from Dartmouth with a degree in psychology and government. While wearing a green and white uniform, she appeared in 112 games. Her most successful season was her final year, scoring four goals and tacking on seven assists for a career-high 11 points. She also had three power play goals and the game winner against Northeastern on New Year's Eve.
